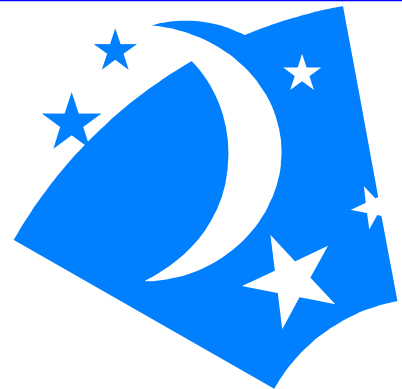


School Family Potluck
